13. AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING LOITERING AND OFFENSIVE LANGUAGE (MAY 26, 1904)

Every person who shall be loitering, idling, or loafing, upon any highway, public street, bridge, or sidewalk in the city, or upon any fence, railing or other structure upon or adjacent to any highway, public street, or sidewalk in said city, and who shall within the hearing of any passenger upon any such highway, public street or sidewalk, use or utter any scurrilous, obscene, indecent, or insulting language, whether the same shall be addressed to any person passing upon any such highway, public street or sidewalk, or to any other person, or to no person in particular, and all nightwalkers wandering from place to place in the night season without any lawful occasion, shall pay a fine not exceeding seven dollars for each offense.
