

42. AMENDMENT TO “AN ORDINANCE RELATIVE TO THE CREATION OF A CONSERVATION COMMISSION FOR THE CITY OF GROTON” (AMENDED SEPTEMBER 16, 1974)

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the City of Groton at adjourned regular meeting thereof held July 20, 1970 **and August 1974** that pursuant to Section 7-131a of the Connecticut General Statutes, Revision of 1958, as amended, there shall be created a Conservation Commission for the City of Groton as follows:

Section 1 – There is hereby created for the City of Groton a Conservation Commission which shall consist of five regular members and two alternate members, all of whom shall be electors of such City holding no salaried municipal office.

Section 2 – The members of the Commission shall be appointed by the Mayor of the City of Groton for three years, and alternate members shall be appointed to serve for three years. The Mayor shall fill any vacancy and may remove any member for cause.

Section 3 – The Commission shall have all the powers set forth in Section 7-131a of the Connecticut General Statutes and any other general statute applicable to Conservation Commissions.

Section 4 – The Commission shall select a chairman and a secretary from its members, may adopt rules for the transaction of its business, and shall keep a public record of its activities. It shall, at the annual City meeting, submit a written report for the preceding fiscal year.
