Interim Chair Louis Demicco called the meeting to order at 1:00 p.m. He noted for the record that this meeting is being held at the CMEEC offices located at 30 Stott Avenue, Norwich, CT via telephone and in person. A Public Comment Period

B Selection of Joint Legislative and Governmental Affairs Committee Chair

Interim Chair Demicco volunteered to be Chair with understanding that it would be difficult for him to attend in-person meetings during the day.

After brief discussion and there being no other nominations, a motion was made by Committee Member Robert Staley, seconded by Committee Member Keith Hedrick to appoint Interim Chair Demicco as Chair of the Legislative and Governmental Affairs Committee.

D State Legislative Update: Timothy Shea, Brown Rudnick

Timothy Shea, CMEEC's government relations advisor, walked the Committee through his handout that highlighted proposed legislation that could be of interest to CMEEC, including climate change and green building standards legislation. He also provided the meeting agenda for the Energy and Technology Committee informing the Committee that this would be all of the bills raised by the Energy and Technology Committee this session. Questions from those present ensued including discussion about the shift away from favoring gas pipeline expansion at the legislature and state agencies. Mr. Shea also stated that it is likely that the State considers CMEEC to be subject to the Global Warming Solutions Act.

E APPA Legislative Rally: Review of Talking Points: Brian Forshaw, Energy Market Advisors, LLC

Brian Forshaw, Energy Market Advisors, LLC, provided the Committee with proposed talking points for the APPA Legislative Rally scheduled for February 24-26, 2020 in Washington, DC where members of CMEEC staff, along with Mr. Forshaw, would be meeting with staff members from the Congressional delegation. There was discussion and questions and answers relating to the talking points, especially with respect to the interaction between ISO-NE and Connecticut DEEP and recent correspondence from DEEP to ISO-NE.

There being no further business to come before this Committee, Chair Demicco entertained a motion to adjourn.

A motion was made by Committee Member Hedrick, seconded by Committee Member Westmoreland to adjourn the meeting.

Motion passed unanimously.
